

## 2013 Federal Poverty Guidelines 400

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### **Poverty Guidelines - 2020 Guidelines Will Be Published ...**

Each year Obamacare's cost assistance eligibility levels are based on the Federal Poverty Level Guidelines that are already in place at the start of open enrollment (Nov 15, 2014, for 2015, Nov 1, 2015, for 2016). For 2016, premium subsidies, cost-sharing assistance, and taxes are based on the 2015 Federal Poverty Guidelines.

### **Federal Poverty Level (FPL) - HealthCare.gov Glossary ...**

If you (or your family) make between 100% - 400% of the Federal Poverty Level you may qualify for premium tax credits on the Health Insurance Marketplace. If you (or your family) make less than 138% of the Federal Poverty Level and your state expanded Medicaid, you may qualify for Medicaid or CHIP. (Note: Medicaid eligibility is effectively 138%, not 133%. Also, CHIP eligibility may be considerably higher for children and parents, usually scaling down as children get older.)

### **2013 Federal Poverty Guidelines - Center For Children and ...**

If you want to see what 400% of the poverty level is, you can multiply the 100% Federal Poverty Level dollar amount by 4.00 (so for a 1 person household it is \$11,880 x 4.00 = \$47,520). For 300% FPL multiply by 3.00.

Income between 100% and 400% FPL: If your income is in this range, in all states you qualify for premium tax credits that lower your monthly premium for a Marketplace health insurance plan.

In October 2013, the poverty level became relevant to millions more Americans. That's when the health insurance exchanges for Obamacare opened for enrollment. Those making 400% or less of the poverty level became eligible for tax credits to help pay for insurance costs.

The 2018 federal poverty guidelines have been released. The 2017 guidelines are also provided below for reference. Federal poverty levels are used to determine eligibility for certain federal health programs, including Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). ### **2019 Federal Poverty Guidelines / Federal Poverty Levels**

2019 Federal Poverty Level. As previously mentioned, the FPL and your "modified adjusted gross income" or "MAGI", relative to it is what determines your eligibility for ACA subsidies.. The federal poverty guidelines are on a one year lag when it comes to determining ACA (also referred to as Obamacare) health coverage subsidies.

### **Persons in family Poverty guideline 400% 500%**

If your income falls below 138% of the federal poverty guidelines, with your state's expanded Medicaid program, you should qualify based on your projected income. With an income between 100% and 400% of the FPL, you qualify for tax credits applied to lower your monthly premium when enrolling in a Marketplace health insurance plan.

### **Federal Poverty Guidelines - Families Usa**

Often these levels are 100% (or below), 133%, 138%, 150%, 200%, 300% and 400%. ### **2013 Poverty Guidelines (DHHS and USCIS) - Drew Law Office ...**

You qualify for the premium subsidy only if your modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) is at 400% FPL or below. If your MAGI goes above 400% FPL even by \$1, you lose all the subsidy. See Stay Off the Obamacare ACA Premium Subsidy Cliff.
