Eye-gaze studies, in which cameras carefully track children's attention, show young children look at the pictures over 90% of the time during picture-book reading, and only rarely at the words.

The Wordless Book

Using everyday tasks to promote speech and language is relatively easy, you just have to use your imagination: 1. Bathtime. Use lots of vocabulary during bath-time, talk to your child, and model the words for them. Introduce vocabulary: wash, scrub, rinse, clean, brush, dry, splash, soap, towel, water, tap, body parts.

Talk to kids about which parts are beginning, middle, and end. Predict: When you get to the middle, see if you can predict the ending.

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Wordless picture books like Pat Schories' Breakfast for Jack (Jack's Books) and Peter Sis' Dinosaur!, rely entirely on pictures to tell a story. These books encourage vocabulary development and 'reading the illustrations.' When sharing a wordless picture book, give your child an opportunity to look through the entire book.

Place a collection of wordless books in a book bin. Revisit them often. Allow students to have free access to them (they could even be a station activity). Here is a list of some of my favorites.
