There are 4 rules that apply to long quotations that are different from regular quotations: The line before your long quotation, when you're introducing the quote, usually ends with a colon. The long quotation is indented half an inch from the rest of the text, so it looks like a block of text. There are no quotation marks around the quotation.

In-text citation capitalization, quotes, and italics/underlining. Always capitalize proper nouns, including author names and initials: D. Jones. If you refer to the title of a source within your paper, capitalize all words that are four letters long or greater within the title of a source: Permanence and Change.

Long quotations comprise of more than one sentence – avoid using them as evidence. Your assessor will not mark you highly if the bulk of your paragraphs consist of long quotations. You should aim to keep your quotations less than 2 lines on an A4 writing page. If you have a long quotation you wish to use, be selective.

Direct quotes are placed within quotation marks (" ") and are cited using an in-text citation using the expected formatting style (APA, MLA, etc.). For example (with an APA-formatted citation): " The systematic development of literacy and schooling meant a new division in society, between the educated and the uneducated " (Cook-Gumperz, 1986, p. 27).

MLA, which sets style for papers written in the field of the arts and humanities, calls a long quote that consists of more than four lines of prose or three lines of verse just that: a long quotation. Omit quotation marks as you begin the quote on a new line, indenting it 1 inch from the left margin; you do not have to indent the right margin.

Writing Tip: Block quotations should be used sparingly. Remember that your voice is important -- after all it is your paper! Instead of using a block quotation, consider taking pieces of the larger quote and either paraphrase them (put their ideas into your own words and provide an in-text citation) or include precise, shorter quotations from the larger quote, integrated into your own sentences.

Quotations and Block Quotes in Chicago Referencing

Format quotations of 40 words or more as block quotations: Do not use quotation marks to enclose a block quotation. Start a block quotation on a new line and indent the whole block 0.5 in. from the left margin. Double-space the entire block quotation. Do not add extra space before or after it.

For example, if I were quoting someone in this sentence I would " write the quote like this in quotations and follow it with " (Jones 98). Create a works cited page to cite the author and his work. Basic MLA format lists work starting with the author ' s last name followed by a comma, his first name followed by a period, and the work you are citing from in italics followed by a period.

Introduce a long direct quote, then set it off in a block. A long quote is anything that ' s longer than 4 typed lines. You ' ll present these quotes in a block of text set off from the rest of your paragraph. Because the quote is set off in a block, you don ' t need to put quotation marks around it.

Main Body is the place you ' re meant to state a quote or two, depending on the length of a paper. A standard 5-paragraph essay will imply you to use 2-3 quotes in the main body. More quotes aren ' t necessary for such a short assignment. Two quotes in the main body will do just fine.

Adding Long Quotes In Papers

Long quotations For quotations that are more than four lines of prose or three lines of verse, place quotations in a free-standing block of text and omit quotation marks. Start the quotation on a new line, with the entire quote indented ½ inch from the left margin while maintaining double-spacing.
