Aisthesis is broken up into fourteen "scenes" that amount to a "counter-history of 'aesthetic modernity'" (page xiii). Modernity is not the marking of the autonomy of different arts and their retreat from everyday life, as in so many theories of "kitsch," but is the opposite for him.
