Math Anticipation Guide Lesson Plans & Worksheets

An anticipation guide is used to help students access their prior knowledge about a topic, to guide comprehension and to stimulate interest in material to be read. Directions: 1) The teacher previews the material to be read and selects the most significant content or concepts.

An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts presented in the text; they're often structured as a series of statements with which the students can choose to agree or disagree.

Anticipation Guide: Math + Science = Quality Food

For math there are different ways a teacher can use an anticipation guide. For example when students are learning about a new concept, ex: geometric figures, the teacher can have a set of statements. These statements can include equations, problems, or vocabulary.
