Chinese polearms that resembled swordstaves were also commonly used in ancient China from the late Warring States/Qin Dynasty to the Han Dynasty era. These were known as the pi (钃), translated into English as either sword-staff or long lance, and a ranseur-like swordstaff weapon called the sha (钁) with a blade that was around 62cm long and a hilt that was ~19cm long.
