Keep in mind the other confounding factors that may influence the comparison of rates of adverse events. A confounding factor is anything that is coincidentally associated with an event (in this case, an AEFI), which may mislead the investigator into wrongly concluding that the factor is influencing the rate of an adverse vaccine reaction.
