The Battle of Killiecrankie On the 27th July 1689, Scottish Government forces under the command of Major-General Hugh MacKay of Scourie are defeated by a Jacobite army, loyal to the deposed King James VII/II, commanded by John Graham of Claverhouse, Viscount Dundee at the Battle of Killiecrankie, south of Blair Atholl in Perthshire.

1689 - Battle of Killiecrankie. To men such as John Graham, Viscount Dundee (formerly plain Graham of Claverhouse - the 'Bluidy Clavers' of the Covenanters), James's deposition was an outrage. Dundee took to the hills, managing to raise some of the clans, but otherwise finding little support.

The Battle of Killiecrankie July 27, 1689 In 1689, after William of Orange (William III) had landed on the shores of England ousting King James II from the dual thrones of England and Scotland, the Scottish Highland clans were to a great extent sympathetic to their former King.

The Battle of Killiecrankie - Clan Cameron

The Battle of Killiecrankie (Scottish Gaelic - Cath Raon Ruairidh) was fought between Highland Scottish clans supporting King James VII of Scotland (also known as James II of England) and troops supporting King William of Orange on 27 July 1689, during the first Jacobite uprising. Although it was a stunning victory for the Jacobites, it had little overall effect on the outcome of the war and left their leader dead.
