On 13 August 1940 the 1st South African Infantry Division was officially constituted – consisting of the 1st SA Brigade Group already in Kenya and the 2nd and 5th South African Infantry Brigade Groups. Brig-Gen George Brink was appointed as commander with Lt. Col W.H.E. Poole as GSO 1. The Division HQ landed at Mombasa on 11 November 1940.

The build up of British and Dominion troops began with the transfer by sea of the two West African brigades to East Africa, where they joined the two East African brigades. Two infantry divisions were formed in July 1940, the 1 (African) and 2 (African) Divisions (soon redesignated as the 11 (African) and 12 (African) Divisions), each comprising one East African and one West African brigade.
