Nursing Intervention for Cesarean Section Postoperative. Assess the condition of output / dischart out; number, color, and odor from the operation wound. R / recording the changes in output. The existence of a darker color with a bad smell may be a sign of infection. Tell the client the importance of wound care during the postoperative period.

You have questions or concerns about your C-section, or having a new baby. SEEK CARE IMMEDIATELY IF: You feel that you may hurt yourself or your baby. You have trouble breathing all of a sudden. Caring for your wound after a Caesarean section

You'll probably be in hospital for 3 or 4 days after a caesarean section, and may need to take things easy for several weeks. Recovering in hospital. The average stay in hospital after a caesarean is around 3 or 4 days. You may be able to go home sooner than this if both you and your baby are well. While in hospital:
