Choosing A Medigap Policy Guide
A Medigap policy is private health insurance that helps supplement Original Medicare. This means it helps pay some of the health care costs that Original Medicare doesn't cover (like copayments, coinsurance, and deductibles). These are "gaps" in Medicare coverage.

Don't confuse Medigap Plan D with Medicare Part D. Part D is the Medicare prescription drug benefit which providers prescription drug coverage. Plan D is a product to supplement Original Medicare and doesn't include prescription drug coverage.

Find a Medigap policy that works for you - medicare.gov
Medigap policies are standardized. Every Medigap policy must follow federal and state laws designed to protect you, and it must be clearly identified as "Medicare Supplement Insurance." Insurance companies can sell you only a "standardized" policy identified in most states by letters. All policies offer the same basic Benefits [Glossary] but some offer additional benefits, so you can choose which one meets your needs.
