General and subspecialty clinics include epilepsy, stroke, movement disorders, memory disorders and dementia, multiple sclerosis, neuromuscular diseases, neuro-oncology, sleep disorders, and pediatric neurology. Disorders appropriate for referral include all those of the central nervous system, the peripheral nervous system and diseases of muscle.

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Movement disorders are comprised of a variety of conditions resulting in abnormalities in the motor system. These include Parkinson's disease and other Parkinsonian syndromes, tremors, dystonia, Wilson's disease, tics and Tourette syndrome, and Huntington's disease.
