In the theory of communicative competence, Habermas operates with the concept of a pragmatic truth-the "consensus theory of truth," as he calls it-and what he calls "pragmatic universals." He outlines the ideal speech situation which is the one to bring about "true" consensus and which is free of external and internal coercion.

(1980) pragmatic competence is only seen as a subcomponent to the more general level of communicative competence. The development of the communicative competence model started with Chomsky in the 1960s when he used grammatical competence as a theoretic ground for teaching, learning, and testing languages.

contextualized fashion, Canale & Swain (1980) included pragmatic competence as one important component of their model of communicative competence. In this model, pragmatic competence was identified as sociolinguistic competence and defined as the knowledge of contextually appropriate language use (Canale & Swain, 1980; Canale, 1983).

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
