J. H. STAPE (1949-2016) Biographical sketch John Henry Stape (1949 – 2016) was a prolific scholarly writer and university teacher. In Canada, his academic career included positions at the University of British Columbia, the University of Toronto (from which he received his PhD in 1979), Concordia in Montreal, and Western in London, Ontario.

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"The Idiots" is a short story by Joseph Conrad, his first to be published. It first appeared in The Savoy in 1896. The story was included in the Conrad collection Tales of Unrest, published in 1898. Set in Brittany, the story describes a couple whose children have intellectual disability; the strain on the family leads eventually to murder.

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The figure of the nineteenth-century female suicide, a young woman who drowns herself to escape disgrace, serves as a poignant moral reminder for Victorian women to value their sexual purity. Conrad repeatedly invokes the figure of the female suicide from his early story " The Idiots " to the novels The Secret Agent, and Chance.

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
