Emotional and/or psychological abuse typically is defined as an act that causes emotional pain, distress or anguish. Common forms of emotional/psychological abuse include verbal assaults, intimidation, humiliation, threats, insults, harassment and treating senior citizens like children. Aging is accompanied by changes in physical and mental health, making older adults particularly vulnerable to crime, abuse, and neglect. Isolation, memory loss, and a diminished cognitive ability make it even easier to defraud or coerce them. The full extent of elder abuse is uncertain.

Many states have enacted specific elder abuse laws, some of which criminalize elder abuse specifically while others add enhanced penalties for crimes that target seniors. For instance, New York has a "Granny Law" enacted in 2008 that makes assault of a person over the age of 65 a second-degree assault, provided the assailant is at least 10 years younger.

What Are the Criminal Penalties for Elder Abuse?

Elder Abuse Elder abuse is a term related to a varied of crimes intentionally committed against a person who is an elder or dependent adult. An elder is 65 years or older, and a dependent adult is over the age of 18 but unable to adequately care for himself because of physical or developmental disabilities.

(Causes or permits infliction of physical pain or mental suffering on elder or dependent adult under circumstances or conditions likely to produce great bodily harm or death) A person, under circumstances or conditions likely to produce great bodily harm or death, willfully causes or permits an elder or dependent adult to suffer

What is Elder Abuse? Is it Really A Crime?

Because concern for elder abuse as a criminal issue is a fairly recent development, there are gaps in our knowledge about the extent and causes of such abuse. The majority of research on elder mistreatment has focused on victims; the motivations of abusers and the relationship between abuses and victims have received little attention.
