3.1 Cutaneous Manifestations. The most common clinical association of autoimmune thyroid disease is dyschromia, which generally has an autoimmune etiology. The most frequent hyperchromia is melasma, a localized café-au-lait hyperpigmentation over the

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forehead, upper lips, cheeks, and chin.

Cutaneous Manifestations Of Endocrine Diseases
Dermatologic manifestations include chronic mucocutaneous candidiasis, alopecia areata, and vitiligo, as well as dry, scaly, hyperkeratotic skin and brittle nails. Along with treatment addressing the endocrine abnormalities of APS, antifungal agents, such as azoles and amphotericin, are used to treat the cutaneous features of APS.

Acanthosis Nigricans. Acanthosis nigricans is defined by

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diffuse velvety thickening and hyperpigmentation of the skin, mostly involving the axillae, neck, skin folds, groin, and perineum [4] (Fig. 3). It is a common manifestation of endocrine and malignant diseases [8].

Cutaneous Manifestations of Endocrine Disease

Endocrine diseases may result in changes in cutaneous function and morphology, which cause various skin manifestations, including nonspecific or pathognomonic signs. Some of these manifestations are already known dermatologic diseases with only increased frequency in this patient group.
