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### **Dialectical Journal Informational Text**

What Is a Dialectical Journal? The purpose of a dialectical journal is for the reader to write down interesting, memorable or important passages in a text as he reads literature. By writing about literature, the reader is able to make personal connections and interpretations. The word "dialectic" is a method of intellectual investigation.

### **How to Write a Dialectical Journal | Pen and the Pad**

Using a dialectical journal will allow them to pull out important passages and document analytical comments they may have. I want them to get used to the idea that in this class we read and reread literature. And once we've done that, we take notes on our observations and reactions to the text. This is what real literature study is, and it is very different from "Reading" class! This dialectical journal assignment has all but the last passage pre-selected for students.

\*taken from another text Dialectical Journal - This section should be recorded in a Dialectical Journal (two columns on the paper); the columns need to be set up and labeled in the following way: EVIDENCE - Label for the left side of the paper: evidence is defined as the quote and page number.

The dialectical journal necessitates students to use the text to create questions and inferences. The first Common Core Standard for reading literature asks students to cite textual evidence to support analysis and inferences (CCSS RL 9-10 1).

A dialectical journal is a way to logically discuss your ideas and opinions about a book. As you read your novel you are going to identify key pieces of text and explain the significance in your own terms. This is another way to annotate/highlight the text to help your understanding of a novel.

Think of your dialectical journal as a series of conversations with the texts we read during this course. The process is meant to help you develop a better understanding of the texts we read.

### **DIALECTICAL JOURNALS**

The purpose of using dialectical journals is to help students document their thoughts about a text and to transfer these thoughts into their writing in an organized, coherent manner.

### **Dialectical Journal Format and Example**

In a dialectical journal (Berthoff), students record a quote, phrase, or word with a page number in the first column, and in the second column they record their reactions or interpretations (see fig. 3).
