Drusen. The appearance of drusen — yellow deposits — in the retina indicates the development of early-stage dry macular degeneration (left). As the condition progresses to the advanced stage (right), the drusen get larger, bleeding occurs and the light-sensitive cells that make up the

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macula become scarred.

Macular drusen are yellow deposits that develop between the retinal pigment epithelium and the choroid layer – the layer of blood vessels that supply nutrients to the macula. There are many factors that lead to the development of AMD, but one of them is the inability of the macula to get rid of waste products or to get oxygen rich nutrients from the underlying tissue.

Optic nerve drusen can be verified a

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number of ways in your eye doctor's office or at a specialist: OCT, CT scan, but the most common way to verify optic nerve drusen is to use a B Scan. A B Scan is an ultrasound test that is used over top of the patient's closed eyelid, that will show the buried drusen quite distinctly as small reflective particles within the optic nerve.

People with more drusen, and larger drusen, are at higher risk than those with fewer, smaller drusen. Drusen are categorized as small, intermediate and large. This is important, because patients with about 20 or more intermediate drusen or at least one large “ druse ” were found to benefit from taking the AREDS2 antioxidant vitamins (lutein, vitamin C, vitamin E, zinc and copper).

Drusen - What You Need to Know
Drusen are detected during a dilated eye exam. To check your eyes, your ophthalmologist will dilate (widen) your pupils using dilating eyedrops and examine your eyes with an ophthalmoscope, a device that allows him or her to see the retina and other areas at the back of the eye. This examination will allow him or her to see if drusen are present. If your ophthalmologist detects large drusen, he ...
