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Dualism - Philosophy

In the philosophy of mind, dualism is the theory that the mental and the physical—or mind and body or mind and brain—are, in some sense, radically different kinds of thing.

Dualism and Mind. Dualists in the philosophy of mind emphasize the radical difference between mind and matter. They all deny that the mind is the same as the brain, and some deny that the mind is wholly a product of the brain.

Mind and body dualism represents the metaphysical stance that mind and body are two distinct substances, each with a different essential nature. Originated in the ancient period, a well-known version of dualism is credited to Rene Descartes of the 17 th century. According to him, human beings consisted of two quite unlike substances which could not exist in unity.

This type of dualism states that there is only one kind of substance in the world, which is physical. But it has two kinds of property?physical (body) and non-physical (mind). When physical things are arranged in the proper manner (that of the living beings), they elicit their property of non-physical things.

As noted, the basic starting point in this conception is that the physical world is inherently evil, and unredeemably so, which leads to a radical dualism in how reality and human beings are understood (body/physical=bad; soul/spirit=good).

Another common argument against dualism consists in the idea that since human beings (both phylogenetically and ontogenetically) begin their existence as entirely physical or material entities and since nothing outside of the domain of the physical is added later on in the course of development, then we must necessarily end up being fully developed material beings.

Dualism Vs. Materialism in Philosophy

The mind and brain are different from one another. Two common philosophies exist on the nature of a brain-mind connection: dualism and monism. Monism is the doctrine that denies any distinction or difference between the physical brain and the abstract concept of the mind. In monism, the two are seen as different parts of the same entity.

Typically humans are characterized as having both a mind (nonphysical) and body/brain (physical). This is known as dualism. Dualism is the view that the mind and body both exist as separate entities. Descartes argued that the mind interacts with the body at the pineal gland.
