Within a matter of weeks, the Duchess's ball began to be shrouded in myth. One correspondent described it as "a sort of farewell ball", another lamented "all the young men who appeared there shot dead a few days after". In fact, only 11 of the Duchess's nearly 100 military guests died on the battlefield.

Known as "the Magician", James was the supplier for the Duke of Wellington's (Nicholas Rowe) army and he would normally not have received an invitation to a high society event.
