The Nicomachean Ethics (/ n k o m æ k i n /; Ancient Greek: ἠθικὰ νικομάχεια, *thika Nikomacheia*) is the name normally given to Aristotle's best-known work on ethics. The work, which plays a pre-eminent role in defining Aristotelian ethics, consists of ten books, originally separate scrolls, and is understood to be based on notes from his lectures at the Lyceum.
