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Using The AMA Guides - Workers' Compensation Law

Doctors in workers' compensation cases often use the AMA Guides to determine whether an injured worker has an impairment rating after a job-related accident. As Dean Spieler noted, The AMA Guides have been in effect since 1971 and are now in widespread use.

Workers Compensation PPD for Shoulder ... - Perkins Studdard

Workers' compensation is meant to protect both employers and employees in the event of workplace injuries. This insurance – paid for by the employer – is paid out to injured workers. If a medical impartment rating is more than 50 percent, the worker is considered to have a total disability, meaning he cannot return to work.

Usage - AMA Guides - AMA Guides

If your compensation rate is \$500 per week, then you are entitled to \$16,875, which is \$500 multiplied by 33.75. This is the Georgia statute that governs workers' compensation PPD ratings.

Understanding the AMA Guides in Workers' Compensation ...

Your workers compensation authorized treating physician usually will determine your permanent partial disability rating for your shoulder injury. Georgia law requires them to use a book published by the American Medical Association called the Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment.

The American Medical Association's Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment (or AMA Guides) is mandated for use in many workers' compensation systems. The AMA Guides are now in their sixth edition, and various states are using either the third, fourth, fifth, or sixth edition of the Guides.

USE OF AMA IMPAIRMENT RATINGS: SEIZE THE MOMENT TO REDUCE ...

The ratings are set according to the American Medical Association Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment (6th edition). For a shoulder injury such as yours, with impingement and/or a rotator cuff tear, the AMA Guides, on page 402, Table 15-5, provides for an impairment rating that can be accounted for in a couple of different ways.

PPD Rating | What is Permanent Partial Disability Rating?

Georgia's workers' compensation system is designed to assist workers with both minor injuries as well as more significant and long lasting medical problems. If your injury is minor, and you miss no work or only a day or two, you will be eligible for medical care but nothing else.

State Board of Workers' Compensation

Permanent partial disability (PPD) is one of the three primary benefits provided by Georgia workers compensation. The other two benefits are income benefits for wage loss and medical benefits. Permanent partial disability benefits compensate injured workers when they suffer permanent impairment as a result of a work-related injury.
