How to Teach Guided Reading - Literacy Ideas

Guided reading is all about practice, so have students whisper read (or silently read - in late first grade and second grade) all of the words on their own. That said, some students in Kindergarten or early first grade may need more support than the book introduction in order to be successful with the text.

How to Teach a Guided Reading Group & Best Practices ...

Guided reading is one component of the shared reading block during which the teacher provides support for small, flexible groups of beginning readers. The teacher helps students learn to use reading strategies, such as context clues, letter and sound knowledge, and syntax or word structure, as they read a text or book that is unfamiliar to them.

Guided Reading was developed in New Zealand in the 1960s. Later, when it came the United States, educators including Gay Su Pinnell and Lesley's own Irene Fountas enhanced it over time. In 1996, Fountas & Pinnell published their highly influential text, Guided Reading: Good First Teaching for All Children (Heinemann). This text revolutionized the teaching of reading, and is still used by over a million teachers worldwide.
