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by genre (books in the same genre are gathered together in bookshelves). It's a shame that fiction and non-fiction aren't separated, and you have to open a bookshelf before you can sort books by country, but those are fairly minor quibbles.

Use block quotations sparingly. There may be times when you need to quote long passages. However, you should use block quotations only when you fear that omitting any words will destroy the integrity of the passage. If that

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passage exceeds four lines (some sources say five), then set it off as a block quotation.

Format quotations of 40 words or more as block quotations: Do not use quotation marks to enclose a block quotation. Start a block quotation on a new line and indent the whole block 0.5 in. from the left margin. Double-space the entire block quotation. Do not add extra space before or after it.

Quotation marks are required at the beginning and at the end of the extract. However, if your quotation is more than three lines of poetry, I would suggest that you treat it
