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How to Write Chapter Titles in an Essay | Synonym

No matter what kind of novel you're writing, it's a good idea to introduce a sense of place in your opening chapter. Readers want to open a book and experience instant immersion. They want to experience the setting with all five senses and feel as if they are really there, right in the midst of the story.

Writing Fiction: How to Divide a Novel Into Chapters

You could end a novel's chapter after an interlude instead. Or you could split a lengthy scene in the novel into two chapters. More generally, you could end a chapter when the action is about to shift to another time and another place, or on a cliff-hanger — that is, between a compelling question being raised and the answer being provided.

Begin your summary by stating the main characters and setting of the chapter in one to two sentences. The main characters are who the story is about. They do most of the acting, feeling and talking in the chapter.

Write a short synopsis of your whole book at the beginning of the outline. Keep it short, about a paragraph long. Follow the synopsis by the title of chapter one. Write two or three sentences about the chapter from your point form notes. Include all main points. Write them in the order they appear in the book. Write similar sentences for each chapter.

How to Write Chapter After Chapter Until You Have a Book

Find the correct chapters titles in your book. Use the book's table of contents, or turn to each chapter's beginning to find chapter titles easily. Copy the chapter titles into your essay. Include all punctuation marks, such as exclamation points and question marks, if they appear as part of a chapter's title.

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
