The Hanafi school is one of the four religious Sunni Islamic schools of jurisprudence. It is named after the scholar Abū Ḥanīfa an-Nuʿmān ibn Ṭhābit, a tabi'i whose legal views were preserved primarily by his two most important disciples, Abu Yusuf and Muhammad al-Shaybani.

Islamic Jurisprudence & Law Islamic law is oftentimes used as a synonym for sharia . However, we must understand this Islamic law to be a law created by men, and not the law of God which itself is perforce unknown and unknowable.

Islamic Jurisprudence and English Common Law

This last point is key: Islamic law is fundamentally based on four sources: the Koran, the Sunna, ijm and qiyas. The reality, however, of the term uʿl al-fiqh is deeper.

Therefore, in Islamic Jurisprudence, the term 'law' possesses a permanent and universal character, which is not subject to any alteration. 'Law' in Islamic terminology signifies the word 'Hukm' or 'Hukm al-Sharii), which is defined as: "Law is a Rule of human conduct established by a communication from God, expressive either of demand or indifference or a mere declaration.

If the legality was not based on an explicit command in the quran, then the jurists would turn to the explicit commands in the hadith.

Four Schools Of Islamic Law - 10/2020

Islamic jurisprudence may be defined as a process by means of which jurists derive sets guidelines, rules and regulations (the Shari'ah) from the principles of the Qur'an and the Sunnah. Over the centuries, these have been formulated and elaborated upon by successive generations of learned jurists, through interpretation, analogy, consensus and disciplined research.

The Islamic Origins of the Common Law

Fiqh, Muslim jurisprudence—i.e., the science of ascertaining the precise terms of the Shariah, or Islamic law. The collective sources of Muslim jurisprudence are known as usul al-fiqh. While Shariah is considered to be divine and immutable, fiqh, the human effort to know the Shariah, is imperfect and changeable.
