The final trust from the first wave of organisations placed in special measures following the Keogh review

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has come out of the regime. North Cumbria University Hospitals NHS Trust was one of 11 organisations placed in special measures in 2013 after NHS England medical director Sir Bruce Keogh's review of hospital trusts with high mortality rates.

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The review, started in February 2013, was led by Professor Sir Bruce Keogh, the National Medical Director for the NHS in England. It looked at the quality of the care and treatment provided by 14 trusts identified as

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having higher than average death rates in the two years before the start of the review.
