Kohlberg believed that moral development, like cognitive development, follows a series of stages.He used the idea of moral dilemmas—stories that present conflicting ideas about two moral values—to teach 10 to 15 year-old boys about morality and values.

Kohlberg's six stages of moral development, for example, have been criticized for elevating Western, urban, intellectual (upper class) understandings of morality, while discrediting rural, tribal, working class, or Eastern moral understandings.
