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Lev Vygotsky – Sociocultural Theory of Cognitive Development

Lev Vygotsky was another psychologist who believed children learn about their world through physical interaction. Vygotsky ' s sociocultural theory asserts that learning is an essentially social process in which the support of parents, caregivers, peers and the wider society and culture plays a crucial role in the development of higher psychological functions.

Vygotsky's approach to child development is a form of social constructivism, based on the idea that cognitive functions are the products of social interactions. Vygotsky emphasized the collaborative nature of learning by the construction of knowledge through social negotiation.

Child Development Theories: Lev Vygotsky

Lev Vygotsky, a Russian psychologist, developed a theory of cognitive development in children known as the Vygotsky ' s Sociocultural Theory of Cognitive Development in the early twentieth century. The main assertion of the Vygotsky theory is that cognitive development in early childhood is advanced through social interaction with other people, particularly those who are more skilled.

Piaget and Gesell believed development stemmed directly from the child, and although Vygotsky acknowledged intrinsic development, he argued that it is the language, writings, and concepts arising from the culture that elicit the highest level of cognitive ...

Lev Vygotsky (1896-1934) was a Russian teacher who is considered a pioneer in learning in social contexts. As a psychologist, he was also the first to examine how our social interactions influence our cognitive growth.

Social learning theories help us to understand how people learn in social contexts (learn from each other) and informs us on how we, as teachers, construct active learning communities. Lev Vygotsky (1962), a Russian teacher and psychologist, first stated that we learn through our interactions and communications with others.

Social Development Theory (Vygotsky) - Learning Theories

Vygotsky ' s Social Development Theory, or SDT, introduced two major principles: Cognitive development is limited up to a certain extent or within a certain range, at any given age of the individual; and; An individual ' s full cognitive development requires social interaction.

The major theme of Vygotsky ' s theoretical framework is that social interaction plays a fundamental role in the development of cognition. Vygotsky (1978) states: " Every function in the child ' s cultural development appears twice: first, on the social level, and later, on the individual level; first, between people (interpsychological) and then inside the child (intrapsychological).

According to Vygotsky, the zone of proximal development is "[The] distance between the actual developmental level as determined by independent problem solving and the level of potential development as determined through problem-solving under adult guidance or in collaboration with more capable peers." (Lev Vygotsky, Mind in Society, 1978).
