Pain typically occurs in the distribution of a dermatome and goes below the knee to the foot.

Peripheral nerve compression can mimic cervical or lumbar spine radiculopathy. Electromyography and eliciting symptoms by tapping over the compressed nerve aid in making a diagnosis. Possibly the most overlooked of these is catamenial sciatica, a condition whereby endometriosis affects the sciatic or other nerves of the lower extremity and causes sciatica that coincides with menstruation 11,12.*
