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Acute upper airway obstruction can be caused by foreign body aspiration, viral or bacterial infections (croup, epiglottitis, tracheitis), anaphylaxis, burns or trauma. Initially stable and partial obstruction may worsen and develop into a life-threatening emergency, especially in young children.

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Oropharyngeal airway (OPA) and nasopharyngeal airway (NPA) adjuncts are designed to address airway obstruction and free the airway practitioner. Both adjuncts are generally only tolerated in unconscious patients. If a patient is tolerating an OPA or NPA consider the need for an advanced airway practitioner and intubation. Learning Bite

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involves anesthesia for pharyngoscopy, laryngoscopy or tracheoscopy, and possible surgery. In some animals, the severity of the airway obstruction precludes any diagnostic testing before induction of anesthesia and obtaining a secure airway.

The essence of proper management of upper airway obstruction is precise, logical medical decision making and attention to detail. To a large extent, thinking beforehand about the steps to be taken, communicating with team members, and being vigilant supersede

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technical skill in achieving a successful outcome in case management.

The upper airway consists of oropharynx and larynx. Obstruction may occur at three levels: supraglottic, glottic, or subglottic. Airway exam prior to intubation should incorporate several modes of assessment, such as Mallampati, weight, neck mobility, jaw mobility, retrognathia, prominent incisors, hyomental, and thyromental distance.

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
