Florida Long Term Care. Florida is an income cap state, meaning that in order to be eligible for Medicaid long term care benefits there is a hard income limit. Non income cap states allow applicants to spend down money for their care, whereas income cap states require the amount to be no higher than their limit at time of application.

Long-Term Care Hospital PPS | CMS
Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance) covers Skilled nursing care provided in a SNF in certain conditions for a limited time (on a short-term basis) if all of these conditions are met: You have Part A and have days left in your Benefit period to use. You have a Qualifying hospital stay. Your doctor has decided that you need daily skilled care.

There is no limit on how long you can receive any of these services as long as they remain medically necessary and a doctor reorders them every 60 days. There also is no requirement for your condition to improve, or for improvement to be expected.

Financial Requirements - Long-Term Care Information
Medicare considers long-term care, or custodial care, to be primarily non-skilled assistance with daily living activities, such as getting dressed or bathing. Medicare doesn't cover this type of care.

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
