There is no contradiction here at all. The chronology of events becomes evident when viewing the grid below. In John 1:35ff, John the Baptist calls his disciples. He tells them that Jesus is the "Lamb of God" (v. 36) and they stay with Jesus a while (v. 37). In John 1:40-42, Andrew goes to Jesus and tells him about Simon Peter and they follow Jesus.

The Gospel of Luke is based squarely on the eyewitness testimony of the followers of Jesus from the beginning of his ministry in Israel decades before the destruction of the Jerusalem temple in 70 AD. Also, the Infancy narrative is probably based in large part on Mary's testimony of her son's birth.

Jesus was known to have visited Jerusalem (Mark 11:11; John 2:13; 5:1). It is quite possible that Paul could have seen Jesus or heard him during one of Jesus' several trips there. Second, Paul's devotion to the Law would have provided him motivation to be present in Jerusalem at Passover—a time where both he and Jesus would have been in close proximity.
