What is MICHild/Healthy Kids?

MICHild. You pay just \$10 a month for your whole family

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(even if you have more than one child). Are you eligible for MICHild? To qualify for MICHild benefits, your child/children must be under the age of 19, a U.S. citizen and Michigan resident, and meet the

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program's monthly family income limits.

Income limits updated for 2008 – Michigan Poverty Law Program

eligible children in what is known as MICHild. MICHild

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covers uninsured children in families who do not qualify for Medicaid and earn up to 217 percent of the federal poverty level, or \$44,311 annually for a family of three. Michigan charges monthly premiums of \$10 for

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some CHIP children but does not charge cost sharing for health care services.

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MICHild is a health coverage program using State and Federal funds. If a child is over the income guidelines for Medicaid but within the MICHild income guidelines, and if there is no other comprehensive/employer based

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health insurance, and the child has been without comprehensive/employer based health insurance for 6 months, the child is then considered for MICHild eligibility.

Step 3. Choose your health plan. Once you have Medicaid or MICHild is active, you need to choose a health care plan. These plans will be listed in a letter announcing your coverage.

The Department of Health and Human Services begins using revised Federal Poverty Level Guidelines each April. Many federally and state funded programs use the income guidelines to

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determine eligibility for programs and services. Healthcare subsidy programs, Medicaid and Medicare all use the guidelines in their calculations.

Income Eligibility To be eligible for the Child Development and Care (CDC) program at application, a family's gross monthly income must not exceed the maximum monthly gross income

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limit by family size associated with the program entry limit (\$15 Family Contribution category).

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Income Guidelines Children
Under 1 If you have children

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under the age of 1, your income must be above 185 percent and equal to or below 200 percent of the federal poverty guideline amounts. For example, if you are a single parent of one child under the age of 1,

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your annual income must be between \$27, 213.50 (\$14,710 x 185 percent) and \$29,420 (\$14,710 x 200 percent) to qualify for MICHild benefits.

In Michigan this coverage is referred to as “MICHild” and there are some requirements that your children will have to meet to be covered. If you have children under age 19, you may be able to get

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health and dental care for them through MIChild if they meet the following: To start with the child must be under the age of 19.

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MICHild eligibility requires income below 200% of poverty. The new limits are to be used for all other recipients the next time the case is handled but not later than the next redetermination. As a

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result, clients may no longer be eligible for benefits and will be sent a negative action notice.

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What is MICHild/Healthy Kids? MICHild is a health insurance program for uninsured children of Michigan's families. Many HMOs and other health care plans throughout Michigan provide MICHild services. If

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your child qualifies, you pay a monthly premium of only \$10. Even if you have more than one child you pay only \$10 a month.
