Labour migration in Asia and the Pacific According to the most recent ILO estimates, in 2017 there were 163.8 million migrant workers in the world. In terms of gender, men migrant workers represent 58.4 per cent (95.7 million) while women migrant workers represent 41.6 per cent (68.1 million).

Regional differences in population change. Between the Soviet census of 1989 and the Ukrainian census of 2001, Ukraine's population declined from 51,706,600 to 48,457,020, a loss of 2,926,700 people or 5.7% of the 1989 population. However, this trend has been quite uneven and varied regionally.
