The Multidimensional Scale of Perceived Social Support (MSPSS) is a brief measure of social support designed to measure the respondent's perception of the adequacy of the support he/she receives . The original version of the MSPSS is a 12-item scale with 7 possible responses to each statement (scored 0-6) giving a score out of a maximum of 72 with higher score indicating greater perceived social support.
