For most drum music, that means counting sixteenth-notes. In 4/4, sixteenth-notes are counted "1 e & ah 2 e & ah 3 e & ah 4 e & ah." Since you are counting sixteenths, a sixteenth-note or rest will last for one count, an eighth-note/rest will last for two counts, a quarter-note/rest will last for four counts, a half-note/rest will last for eight, and a whole-note/rest will last for sixteen.
