After the first victory, the Muslims conquered most of Spain and Portugal with little difficulty, and in fact with little opposition. In 714, the Caliph al-Walid summoned Ziyad to Damascus to explain his campaign in Spain, but Ziyad took his time travelling North Africa and Palestine, and was finally imprisoned when he arrived in Damascus.
