Now in terms of the overarching Mesopotamian mythology, Enlil and Enki (Ea – in Babylonian) were two of the supreme deities of the southern Mesopotamia – with Enlil often venerated as ‘King of all lands’, the ‘Father of black-headed people’ (referring to Sumerians) and even the ‘Father of Gods’, while Enki was worshipped as the ‘Lord of the Earth’, the creation god.
