The National Land Code 1965 is nearly 45 years old and it is largely a re-enactment of earlier laws.

Land ownership in Peninsular Malaysia is governed by the National Land Code 1965 (NLC), in force since January 1966. Since the law is based on the Torrens System (where "the register is everything") ownership is evidenced by having one's name on the title.

The National Land Code (Malay: Kanun Tanah Negara), is a Malaysian laws which enacted to amend and consolidate the laws relating to land and land tenure, the registration of title to land and of dealings therewith and the collection of revenue therefrom within the States of Johore, Kedah, Kelantan, Malacca, Negeri Sembilan, Pahang, Penang, Perak, Perlis, Selangor, Terengganu and the Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur, and for purposes connected therewith.

### Partition of land Malaysia | Land Partitioning Policy

Pursuant to the National Land Code 1965, every lease granted shall be for a term exceeding 3 years, otherwise, it is regarded as a tenancy. The maximum term for which any lease may be granted shall be 99 years if it relates to the whole of any alienated land and 30 years if it relates to part only thereof. 3.
