Osage Clans

The U.S. government forced all Osage bands to remove from Arkansas and Oklahoma in 1839. The Osage bands were relocated on the Verdigris River in the Kansas part of Indian Territory, where the Osage had agreed to settle in 1825. Thus, removal back to Oklahoma from Kansas in 1871 was a displacement within forty-six years.
