Joining two sentences using a relative pronoun

1. We use relative clauses to make clear which person or thing we are talking

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about: Marie Curie is the woman who discovered radium. This is the house which Jack built. In this kind of relative clause, we can use that instead of who or which: Marie Curie is the woman that discovered radium.

### Relative Clauses - Perfect English Grammar

Conjunctions, on the other hand, merely connect two clauses. Conjunctions can also be used to connect words and phrases.

Relative pronouns only connect clauses.

They do not connect words or phrases.

Defining relative clauses: 1: The relative

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pronoun is the subject: First, let's consider when the relative pronoun is the subject of a defining relative clause. We can use 'who', 'which' or 'that'. We use 'who' for people and 'which' for things. We can use 'that' for people or things. The relative clause can come after the subject or the object ...

### Grammar: Joining Sentences and Relative Clauses - Inglés ...

Relative pronouns are words like who, which and that. A relative pronoun serves two purposes. It acts as the subject or the object of the verb in its clause. It also serves as a conjunction connecting the two clauses. Study the examples given below. I have a friend. She lives in New England. I have a friend who lives in New England.
