It must be noted that if at present you are rowing with a rig that is way outside the normal range, the first changes you make could possibly slow you down until you acclimate to them. At the elite level of flat water rowing, rigging changes tend to be in only very small increments. At this level changes of 1 or 2 centimeters are considered huge.

There is differential in the height of your oarlocks so you can row with your left hand over your right hand, as is customary throughout the rowing community. If your hands tend to collide at the middle of the stroke, or if your boat is constantly down to the port side, you may need to increase the height differential between your right and left hands.

- Inboard is based on the optimal rowing angles (RBN 2009/05) and a function of the arc length on the rower's height. - You can input your desired racing rate. The Oar Length is based on an assumption that average handle speed should be constant in this boat type.

Rigging your boat to make the most of your rowing

Rowing exercise Sit at the " finish " position. Place your outside hand against your rib cage, just under your pectoral muscle, with the heel of your palm touching the ribcage at its (the ribcage ' s) widest point, and with the hand and fingers pointing straight aft — parallel to the keel, back toward the start line (for reference)

8. FISA Gearing. This is the gearing measure designed by Carl Adam and used in the majority of rigging guides. It is nominally the outboard divided by the spread in sweep (or half the span in sculling). This survey uses the definition from the 2006 survey which is (outboard -2)/ spread for sweep and (outboard -2) / (half span) for scull.
