If you have read through this passage, Romans 12:9-21, you can see that the theme is clearly given in the very first sentence: "Love must be sincere." Our English word sincere comes from the Latin sincerus, which means "without wax." It stems from a practice of the early Roman merchants who set their earthen and porcelain jars out for sale.

Paul begins this section of 12:9-13 with the exhortation to " let love be genuine " (verse 9), and then shows what this love looks like.
