The iron mining and railway community in Rosedale came into being in the 1850s. It flourished for two or three generations, but by 1929 it had come to an end. Some of the miners and railway staff may have stayed in Rosedale, but most of them moved on in search of a livelihood elsewhere.

The mine operated for just four years from 1856 working the 9? thick Ellerbeck seam of ironstone. A branch railway was constructed from Ingleby Greenhow together with a 600 yard long incline coming into service in 1858. This branch line was later incorporated into the Rosedale railway which needed a new parallel incline to be built 600 yards ...

Today, the isolated valley of Rosedale and its village of Rosedale Abbey, depends on farming, forestry and tourism, but for much of the late 19th and early 20th centuries it was the scene of a flourishing ironstone mining industry.

The mines were reopened by the Carlton Iron Company in 1881, which transferred steam powered haulage equipment to the East Mines from the Rosedale West Mines after they closed in 1885. In 1900 an electric generator for haulage, drilling and lighting was installed, but this was removed when the company ceased production in 1911.

North York Moors CAM - Rosedale Railway and Ironstone Mines
The remains of an iron mining complex opened during 1861 is located on the western side of Rosedale, 1km south of the village of Rosedale Abbey. The remains of Hollins Mine lies at the eastern end of the monument and is formed by two large openworkings extending onto the dale side with a series of collapsed drift entrances in the base.

There was a small group of mines at Grosmont and others in Rosedale. Railways were extended to the mines, and settlements built for the labour sucked into what had been a very rural area. After the initial rush of companies opening mines, a period of consolidation was needed as iron companies absorbed smaller ventures and workings were rationalised.

Rosedale Mineral Railway - North York Moors
This too was an old railway line, the tracks long since gone, but the flat path makes easy walking. Heather lined both sides of the route while sweeping views across the valley below were wonderful. By my estimation it's roughly 5 miles from the Chimney Bank car park to the famous Lion Inn pub at Blakey Ridge, situated at the highest point in the North Yorkshire Moors.

The mines are closed but plenty of industrial archaeology remains with information boards. A beneficial legacy as far as walkers are concerned is that the mining industry resulted in what is now a disused railway route circling the entire valley above Rosedale Abbey.

Ingleby Manor Ironstone Mine – Out and about
Postscript: At the height of the Rosedale mining era in 1871, the population of the dale had risen from 548 to 2839. Rosedale ironstone was once described as 'the richest ore in North Yorkshire'. Over ¾ of a million tons per year were produced at the mines' peak but as production costs rose and competition with low-priced foreign ore became acute, their days soon became numbered.

Cleveland & North Yorkshire Moors Iron Mining - Northern ...
The Rosedale Mines comprised three separate mines opened around 1860 in a remote moorland valley but with ironstone of significantly better quality. The best had gone by 1890 but Sheriffs Pit continued working until 1911, the East Mines until 1926, providing traffic for the well-known railway branch which closed 1928.

Rosedale - Abandoned Communities
At Rosedale, the railway branches into two levels – the upper line led to the mines above the kilns while the lower one (the one you walk on) served the kilns themselves. Once the iron ore had been processed, it was taken out of the valley by rail and on to County Durham and, later, Middlesbrough (with coal from County Durham coming the other way, to use in the kilns).

The Rosedale Railway was an 11-mile (18 km) goods-only railway line running from Battersby Junction across the heights of the North York Moors in North Yorkshire, England to reach iron ore deposits in the remote hills of the Rosedale valley. It opened in 1861 and closed in 1929.

For 70 years, the peace and tranquillity of Rosedale was shattered by a booming ironstone industry. It's hard to believe today but in the 19th century the area was part of industrial Yorkshire, with mines, kilns and even a moorland railway. In fact, when the mines opened, the population of the dale shot up from 558 people to 2,389 in a mere 20 ...
