Full dress is the most elaborate and traditional order worn by the British Army. It generally consists of a scarlet, dark blue or rifle green high-necked tunic (without chest pockets), elaborate headwear and other colourful items. It was withdrawn from a general issue in 1914, but is still listed in the Army Dress Regulations, which speaks of it as "the ultimate statement of tradition and ...

Royal Engineer Grenade The grenade first appeared on Royal Engineers uniform in 1824 when it was worn on the tail of an Officer's full dress coatee. In 1825 a brass grenade was introduced for other ranks of the Royal Sappers and Miners. Later the grenade came to be worn on the epaulet and then the collar. In 1922

The Regimental Headquarters and the Royal School of Military Engineering are in Chatham in Kent, England.
