Chronic absenteeism affects as many as 6.5 million students nationwide. That's 13% of our total student population! You may think this is just high school students skipping school. But in fact, this problem starts early. At least 10% of kindergarten and first-grade students miss more of the school year.

School Attendance Absenteeism And Student

Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.

Absence Reporting - SchoolMessenger

School districts that have established multi-systemic approaches and policies pertaining to student absenteeism typically experience fewer numbers of dropouts and a greater number of graduates. The compulsory education law (N.J.S.A. 18A:38-28 through 31) requires all children between the ages of 6-16 to attend school.

For each subgroup of students there is a similar pattern: the likelihood of chronic absenteeism increases as students progress into high school. Notably, the stronger overall attendance observed among English learners dissipates over grade levels, such that they experience higher rates of absenteeism than their non-English learner peers when they reach high school.

Across the country, more than 8 million students are missing so many days of school that they are academically at risk. Chronic absenteeism—10 percent or more of school days due to absence for any reason—excused, unexcused absences and suspensions, can translate into students who are unable to master reading, sixth-graders failing subjects and ninth-graders dropping out of high school.
