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New York: Emergency Carbon Monoxide Detection Device Rule ...
Section 1228.4 (c)(1) states: “Carbon monoxide detection shall be provided in accordance with the provisions of this section 1228.4 in every commercial building that (i) contains any carbon monoxide source (including, but not limited to, any garage or any other motor-vehicle-related occupancy) and/or (ii) is attached to a garage and/or (iii) is attached to any other motor-vehicle-related ...

Section 1228 4 Carbon Monoxide

Part 1228 of Title 19 NYCRR is amended by adding a new section 1228.4, to read as follows: **Section 1228.4. Carbon Monoxide Detection in Commercial Buildings (a) Definitions.** In this Section 1228.4, the following terms shall have the following meanings unless a different meaning is clearly implied by the context: (1) **COMMERCIAL BUILDING.**

The “transition period” provides that owners of existing commercial buildings are encouraged to install carbon monoxide detection as quickly as practicable; provides that the owner of an existing commercial building shall not be deemed to be in violation of section 1228.4.

VILLAGE OF NEW PALTZ

The rule will apply to all new and existing commercial buildings and restaurants that have appliances, devices or systems that may emit carbon monoxide, or that have an attached garage. These new provisions will be contained in a new Section 1228.4 to be added to 19 NYCRR Part 1228. Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code

Under the amended regulation, 19 NYCRR Part 1228 Section 1228.4, the new rule will apply to all new and existing commercial buildings that have a carbon monoxide source, an attached garage, or any other motor vehicle related occupancy. Carbon monoxide is an odorless and colorless gas which can cause asphyxiation when inhaled.

Section 915 Carbon Monoxide Detection - UpCodes

Installation of carbon monoxide alarms in compliance with §1228.4(g) of Title 19 NYCRR. This includes, but is not limited to, the installation of carbon monoxide alarms powered solely by a 10-year battery.
