The Importance of the Sibling Relationship “Sibling relationships are emotionally powerful and critically important not only in childhood but over the course of a lifetime. Siblings form a child’s first peer group, and children learn social skills, particularly in managing conflict, from negotiating with brothers and sisters.

The sibling relationship played an important part in explaining differences in children's adjustment, even when controlling for the impact of the parenting they experienced.
