A learning plan is a document that captures plans to acquire knowledge and improve abilities. A learning plan may be a personal plan that captures all of an individual's learning ambitions. Alternately, it can be carefully tailored to a situation, role or program such as an employee who is required to document a learning plan as part of a career development process.
